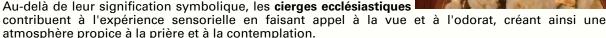

Dans l'église orthodoxe, les cierges ecclésiastiques revêtent une importance primordiale dans les pratiques liturgiques. Ils représentent le Christ, la « Lumière du monde ». Largement utilisés, ils

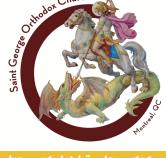
illuminent l'église et nous rappellent que Jésus est là, avec Son peuple. Fabriqués avec de la cire d'abeille pure, ces cierges symbolisent la pureté et représentent Dieu. Ils brûlent en dégageant un parfum aromatique.

En entrant dans une église orthodoxe, il est de coutume d'allumer des cierges en priant pour la santé et le bien-être d'un être cher ou pour un défunt. Les **cierges** ont plusieurs significations spirituelles. C'est le don volontaire d'une personne à Dieu et à Son temple. La douceur de la cire représente le désir du croyant d'obéir à Dieu. Le cierge allumé symbolise le désir ardent d'une personne d'acquérir une image divine et de devenir une nouvelle créature. En outre, les cierges sont un signe de notre foi et de notre union avec la lumière de Dieu. Ils expriment notre amour pour Le Seigneur, Sa Mère, un ange ou un saint.

ECCLESIASTICAL CANDLES IN THE ORTHODOX TRADITION

Meticulously crafted from 100% pure beeswax, **ecclesiastical candles** are made by dipping the wick repeatedly until the desired thickness is achieved. Candles symbolize the presence of Christ, the "Light of the World". They also symbolize purity and represent Christ's divinity. **Ecclesiastical candles** play a central role in Orthodox Christian worship. Extensively used in liturgical ceremonies and services, they illuminate the sacred space of the church and remind us of Christ's presence among His people. Upon entering an Orthodox church, it is customary to light **candles** and pray for the health and well-being of a loved one or in memory of a departed one.

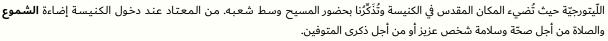
Candles have several spiritual meanings. They represent a voluntary donation from a person to God and His temple. The softness of the wax represents a person's willingness to obey God. The burning candle represents a person's eagerness to acquire a godly image and become a new creation. Candles also serve as a sign of our faith and the unification of humans with God's light. Ecclesiastical candles express our warmth and burning love for the Lord, the Theotokos, an Angel, or a Saint. Beyond their symbolic importance, they enhance the sensory experience of worship by engaging the senses of sight and smell - pure beeswax candles burn with an aromatic fragrance - creating an atmosphere that fosters prayer and contemplation.

The Fathers of the Church attested to the spiritual significance of candles. In the seventh century, St. Sophronius, the Patriarch of Jerusalem, wrote: "Lampadas and candles represent the eternal light

and the light that shines from the righteous." The Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council decreed that the holy icons and relics, the Cross of Christ, and the Holy Gospel were to be honored by censing and **lighting candles**. The blessed Simeon of Thessalonica (15th century) wrote that candles are lit before icons of the Saints for their good deeds that shine in this world.

تُصنع الشموع الكنسيّة (الشمع العسليّ) بعناية من شمع النحل النقي بنسبة 100% وذلك بتغميس الفتيل في الشمع عدّة مرّات إلى أن يتمّ التوصّل إلى سماكة الشمع المطلوبة. ترمز الشموع إلى وجود المسيح "نور العالم". كما ترمز إلى الطهارة وتُمَثِّل ألوهيّة المسيح. للشموع الكنسيّة دورٌ مركزيّ في العِبادة الأرثوذكسيّة. تُستخدم الشموع كثيراً في الخِدم والاحتفالات



للشموع عدة معانٍ روحيّة. فهي تمثل تقدمة طوعيّة وشخصيّة للّه ولهيكله. طبيعة الشمع المِطواع ترمز إلى استعداد الشخص لإطاعة الله، كما تمثّل الشّمعة المشتعلة حماس الشخص لاكتساب صورة إلهيّة وليُصبح مخلوقاً جديداً. ترمز الشموع أيضاً إلى الإيمان واتّحاد البشر بالنّور الإلهي. تُعبِّر الشموع الكنسيّة عن دفئ ولهيب محبّتنا للسيّد، ولوالدة الإله، وللملائكة والقدّيسين. بالإضافة إلى أهميّتها الرمزيّة تُعزّز الشموع التجربة الحسيّة للحياة الإيمانية بتفاعلها مع حواس البصر والشم إذ أنّ الشمع العسليّ يحترق باعثاً عبيراً عطِراً يخلق بدوره جواً يُحفِّز التأمل والصلاة. يُعلّم آباء الكنيسة عن الأهميّة الروحيّة للشموع. فقد كتب القدّيس صُفرونيوس في القرن السابع وهو بطريرك القدس: "تمثّل الفوانيس والشّموع، النور الأزليّ والنور الذي يُشِعّ من الأبرار". كما حدّد آباء المجمع المسكوني السابع أن تُكرَّمَ الأيقونات والذخائر المقدّسة وصليب المسيح والإنجيل المقدّس بالتبخير وإشعال الشموع. كما كتب البارّ سمعان التِسالونيكي (القرن الخامس عشر) أنّنا نُضيء الشموع أمام أيقونات القدّيسين لتُشرق أعمالهم الصالحة في هذا العالم.

The Broken Church

The Church, in her visible and human face, is always broken by the sins of her children. She is hanged upon the Cross of tension stretched between her longing for the heavens as a radiant bride without blemish or fault; and the passions, weaknesses, and falls of her earthly members who knowingly or unknowingly stain her garment, hinder her mission, and pull her downward. This is also the image of the Christian. A believer is one who fully recognizes his weakness and his inclination toward sin yet continually strives toward the heights. This is the struggle of a lifetime. He draws from the grace of God and from constant repentance both his hope and his path to salvation. That is why we find, in the lives of the saints, men and women who reached great heights of purity and holiness, yet still, on their deathbeds, begged for a few more days so that they might begin repentance.

The visible face of the Church is revealed through her members. They are human beings who, through their union with Christ the Head of the Church, are united to one another as one Body. At least, that is how it should be. In reality, they are not always this bright image. Their ongoing repentance, which should be their daily way of life, helps them approach that ideal. But in truth, many within the Church, in all her ranks and orders, are caught up in many other concerns more than in the Lord of the Church Himself who is the very reason for their being in the Church at all.

The believers who are still living in this world are known as the "Church Militant," while those who have entered eternal life are called the "Church Triumphant." Yet the Church remains one; these are only educational terms, not dogmatic distinctions. The "Church Militant," like every human community, is always vulnerable to corruption and failure. Therefore, she constantly needs spiritual struggle, correction, and renewal. Every human group is susceptible to weakness, and the earthly Church is no exception though she possesses the gift of repentance that can wash away the soot of her children from her face. As the Apostle Paul said, "We have this treasure [faith] in earthen vessels [sinful humans], (2 Cor. 4:7)" not in vessels of steel.

The more her members long for eternal life and begin to live it here and now, the more the Church reflects the image of the Kingdom in this world. Otherwise, everything in her remains of this world, even if wrapped in religious language and called "Christian." Renunciation of worldliness and freedom from its temptations are essential conditions for the Church to remain faithful to her Lord. Whoever does not believe with certainty that in the Church we are "poor, yet making many rich; having nothing, yet possessing everything" (2 Cor. 6:10) is still far from the mind of Christ, which the Scriptures command us to acquire and make our own.

For many, the Church is seen as an organization to be run by the spirit of this world, since it holds resources, institutions, and influence. They think that as long as the Church has money, property, and administrative structures, her witness is secure.

They imagine that material wealth alone can ensure her mission and thus they become careless about how it is obtained, justifying questionable means.

They forget that the Lord of the Church provides what is needed when there are pure and faithful hearts devoted to Him. Certainly, earthly goods, when placed in service of the Gospel, can support the Church's witness and ministry. But they cannot create it. True witness is born only from souls in love with Christ, who have made eternal life their goal.

When the People of God are consumed by earthly concerns, they fall into the trap of forgetting the Giver and losing sight of the goal. When believers rely on their own cleverness, planning, and worldly wisdom as though the Head of the Church (Christ) were absent, they estrange the Church from her Lord, instead of estranging themselves from the world (2 Cor. 5:8). Then, they begin to justify whatever seems profitable or advantageous, even crossing the boundaries of what the canons forbid, offering a thousand excuses. The Church needs saints to remain upright. The saints possess discernment, the ability to distinguish between what belongs to God and what belongs to the world. Only the humble keep the Lord's voice audible and obeyed within the Church.

If you desire the Church to be faithful and striving, begin with yourself. Change yourself. Purify and cleanse your heart. Listen to the divine Word with reverence. Examine your thoughts and actions daily. Shake off the dust of sin and clothe yourself with repentance without ceasing. Then you will become a new person able to recognize your Lord's voice and will, to act according to His pleasure, and to pass that breath of life to your brothers and sisters.

Once, a journalist tried to trap Mother Teresa of Calcutta with a provocative question: "What should change in the Church?" She replied with deep wisdom, "You and I." Indeed, as long as believers continue to indulge in easy criticism, casting accusations at this or that person while excusing themselves, the face of Christ in His Church will remain wounded and nothing will change. With their constant criticism, they disfigure His face with their own hands often without realizing it. But ignorance does not excuse responsibility.

Christ is present in His Church: in the Liturgy, in the Holy Mysteries, in lives of virtue, in the patience of those who are suffering, in the joy of the pure, in the faces of those who love, in the struggle of the repentant, in the innocence of the chaste, in the smile of the gentle, in the cheerfulness of the generous, in the simplicity of the humble, in the detachment of the wealthy, in the contentment of the poor, in the integrity of the faithful, in the service of the needy, in the silence of those who are content, and in the hearts of those who are positive. Christ is in our midst, so let us recognize His presence, bear witness to Him, and work so that our sight of Him never fades from among us. Let us be those who light candles instead of merely cursing the darkness.

Then, perhaps, He will forgive our shortcomings and make us part of His little flock.

THE SYNAXARION

On October 12 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Martyrs Probos, Andronikos and Tarachos at Tarsus; Martyr Domnina at Anazarbus in Cilicia; and Virgin Martyr Anastasia of Rome.

On this day we commemorate the holy and blessed Fathers who came together for the second time in Nicaea, during the reign of the pious and Christ-loving Sovereigns Constantine and Irene, against those who impiously, ignorantly and foolishly asserted that the Church of God worshippeth idols, and rejected the august and holy icons.

Verses

Thy champions, O Word, with words as their weapons, Turn to flight the foes of the venerable icons.

The Council met in 787 to refute the Iconoclast heresy, whose camp believed that all depictions of Christ, His Mother and the saints should be destroyed. The iconophiles believed that icons served to preserve the doctrinal teachings of the Church; and they considered icons to be man's dynamic way of expressing the divine through art and beauty. The council decreed that the veneration of icons was not idolatry (Exodus 20:4-5), because the honor shown to them is not directed to the wood or paint, but passes to the prototype, or the person depicted. It also upheld the possibility of depicting Christ, Who became man and took flesh at His Incarnation. The Father, on the other hand, cannot be represented in His eternal nature, because "no man has seen God at any time" (John 1:18).

By the intercessions of the Holy Fathers, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.

When I send Artemas to you, or Tychicós, give diligence to come to me to Nicopolis; for I have determined to winter there. Set forward Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their journey diligently, that they may be lacking in nothing. And let our people also learn how to preside in honorable occupations, so as to help in cases of urgent need, that they should not be unfruitful. All who are with me salute you. Salute those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

THE GOSPEL

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (8:5-15)

The Lord spoke this parable: "A sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell along the path, and was trodden under foot, and the birds of the air devoured it. And some fell on the rock; and as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some fell into good soil and grew, and yielded a hundredfold." And when His Disciples asked Him what this parable meant, Jesus said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God; but for others they are in parables, so that seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. The ones along the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts that they may not believe and be saved. And the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy; but these have no root, they believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way, they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience." As Jesus said this, He called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

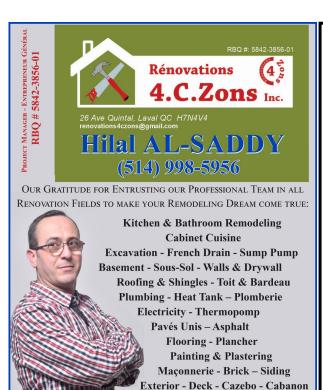

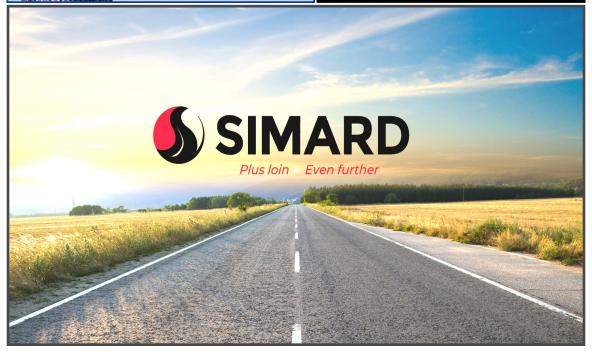
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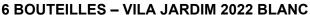
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CATHERINE KISHFY OUR NEW MENTORING PROGRAM DIRECTOR
