

REPOSE OF THE HOLY APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST JOHN THE THEOLOGIAN

St. John the Evangelist is the only apostle given the title "Theologian." This title attests to the spiritual heights he attained and the depth of heavenly wisdom granted to him. John was the

son of Zebedee and Salome, who was the daughter of Saint Joseph the Betrothed. He and his brother James were among the first disciples called by Jesus. Although he was the youngest, he was one of only three who witnessed the Transfiguration. He was also the only one who rested his head on Christ's bosom during the Last Supper and the only one who followed Him to the foot of the cross. At the foot of the cross, he heard the Lord's words addressed to his mother: "Woman, behold your son." Then, he heard the Lord saying to him, "Behold your mother" (Jn 19:26-27). After the Dormition of the



Theotokos, the Apostle John travelled to Ephesus and other cities in Asia Minor to preach the Gospel. He wrote his gospel in Ephesus in 95 CE. He also wrote three universal epistles and the Book of Revelation. All are included in the canonical books of the New Testament.

Saint John lived well past 100 years old and outlived every eyewitness of Christ. The Church calls Saint John the "Apostle of Love" because he taught that without love, one cannot come near God. According to Tradition, after his burial, the disciples found his body had disappeared, leaving no earthly remains. In this way, the Lord honored him in a manner similar to His Mother, the Theotokos.

The **eagle**, a symbol of his lofty theological thoughts and one of the four living creatures that the prophet Ezekiel saw (Ezek 1:10) is the iconographic symbol of John the Theologian. His repose is celebrated on September 26.

MORT DU SAINT APÔTRE ET ÉVANGÉLISTE JEAN LE THÉOLOGIEN

Saint Jean l'Évangéliste est le seul apôtre à avoir reçu le titre de « Théologien ». Ce titre atteste des sommets spirituels qu'il a atteints et de la profondeur de la sagesse céleste qui lui a été accordée. **Jean** est le fils de Zébédée et de Salomé, fille de saint Joseph le Fiancé. Lui et son frère Jacques sont parmi les premiers appelés par Jésus. Bien qu'il soit le plus jeune, il est l'un des trois seuls à avoir été témoin de la Transfiguration, à avoir posé sa tête sur la poitrine du Christ pendant la Cène et le seul à l'avoir suivi jusqu'au pied de la croix. C'est là qu'il entend les paroles du Seigneur adressées à Sa mère : « Femme, voici ton fils » et celles qu'Il lui adresse : « Voici ta mère » (Jn 19, 26-27). Après la Dormition de la Théotokos, l'apôtre Jean se rend à Éphèse et dans d'autres villes d'Asie Mineure pour prêcher l'Évangile. Il rédige son évangile à Éphèse en 95 apr. J.-C. Il écrit également trois épîtres universelles et le livre de l'Apocalypse. Tous ces écrits font partie des livres canoniques du Nouveau Testament.

Saint Jean vit bien au-delà de 100 ans et survit à tous les témoins oculaires du Christ. L'Église l'appelle « l'apôtre de l'amour », car il enseigne que sans amour, on ne peut s'approcher de Dieu. Selon la Tradition, après son enterrement, les disciples découvrent que son corps a disparu ne laissant aucune trace terrestre. C'est ainsi que le Seigneur l'honore d'une manière similaire à celle dont il honora Sa Mère.

L'aigle – symbole iconographique de saint Jean le Théologien et l'une des quatre créatures vivantes que le prophète Ézéchiel a vues (Éz 1, 10) – évoque l'élévation spirituelle de son Évangile et ses visions célestes.

Le jour de son repos dans le Seigneur est célébré le 26 septembre.



القديس يوحنا الإنجيلي هو الرسول الوحيد الذي لُقِّبَ بـ"**الثاولوغوس**" أي المتكلّم باللاهوت ويشهد هذا اللقب على العلوّ الروحيّ الذي وصل إليه وعلى عمق الحكمة السماويّة التي وُهِبَت له. يوحنا هو ابن زبدي وسالومي التي كانت ابنة القديس يوسف الخطيب. هو وأخوه يعقوب كانوا من أوائل الرسل الذين دعاهم المسيح. رغم كونه الأصغر سنّاً فقد كان أحد الثلاثة الذين شَهدوا التجلّي الإلهي. هو التّلميذ الذي اتّكأ على صدر المسيح في العشاء الأخير والوحيد الذي تَبعَه حتّى الصّليب. عند الصّليب سَمِعَ كلمات الرب الموجّهة إلى أمّه قائلاً: "*يا امرأة، هوذا ابنُك*" ومن ثم سمعه قائلاً له "*هوذا أمّك*" (يوحنا 19: 26-27). بعد رُقاد والدة الإله، سافر الرسول يوحنا إلى مدينة أفسس ومدن أخرى في آسيا الصغرى ليُبشّر بالإنجيل. كتب الإنجيل الخاص به في أفسس في العام 95 للميلاد كما كتب أيضاً **رسائله الثلاث الجامعة** وكتاب **سفر الرؤيا** وهي جميعها متضَمَّنَة في الكتب القانونية للعهد الجديد.

تجاوز **القديس يوحنا** عمر المئة وعاش ما بعد جميع الشهود العيان للمسيح. تدعو الكنيسة القديس يوحنا "**رسول المحبة**" لأنه علّم أنّه من دون محبّة لا يستطيع المرء أن يقترب من الله. بحسب التقليد اختفي جسده بعد وفاته دون أن يترك أيّ أثَر دنيويّ. بالتالي كرَّمه الرب بشكل مماثل لوالدته العذراء مريم.

يرمز **النسر** إلى تحليقه بأفكاره اللاهوتية السّامية وهو يصَوَّر معه في أيقوناته، ذلك النسّر الذي هو أحد الحيوانات الأربعة الرمزيّة بحسب رؤية النبيّ حزقيال (حز1:10)

تُعيِّدُ الكنيسة لانتقاله في 26 أيلول.

In the Orthodox Conscience By Metropolitan Saba (Isper)

When you approach matters of faith, information alone is not enough. You need a spiritual mindset to approach religious issues. This mindset is formed gradually, through your living connection with God and His Church. The more you experience life in the pure face of the Lord's Church, the more the "Orthodox conscience" takes root in you. This in turn shapes your mind to become truly Orthodox.

There is no school or textbook that can teach you how to acquire this conscience, mindset, or spiritual sense. The only school is your life in the heart of the Church, your humility, and the work of the Holy Spirit in you. If you pursue humility, it shapes your entire being, not just your mind, so that you are truly open to the Holy Spirit, to your brothers and sisters, and to those around you in the world. Then, the action of the Spirit appears in the way you approach every Church matter: with humility and detachment, seeking God's will and mind, not your own ideas or desires. His action toward your brothers and sisters shows itself in your dealings with them in love. This allows you to distinguish between individual persons and their opinions, enabling you to understand them, even if you disagree. Only then is real dialogue possible. Without it, you reject not only their opinions but also the persons themselves.

Let us make this clearer with examples. For centuries, there has been debate about frequent versus occasional communion. Both sides find canons, teachings, and practices to support their view. How do you discern the truest approach? If you rely only on theological studies, rules, and teachings, you will naturally gravitate to what fits your own thinking, preference, or desire. But the key question remains: How do you know God's will and mind? How do you discern what is best for you and the Church? Here, the Orthodox conscience is essential, for it helps you distinguish between your will and the Spirit's will, between Holy Tradition and local customs that shift with cultures and times, between what the Church has faithfully lived and what today's pressures try to impose.

In every matter of faith, God's mind must shape your churchly conscience alongside the spirit of the canons, the theological sciences, and their purposes. This only happens when you live with a mindset enlightened by the Holy Spirit and His living action from the Church's foundation until today. In Orthodoxy, Holy Tradition means precisely "what has been handed down to us." Tradition is literally "the handing over." When you live in the spirit of this Tradition, your sense of it strengthens. Then the canons, teachings, and theology support you.

But if you rely on them alone, you risk distortion, even while you seek the truth. It is no accident that our holy Fathers and Mothers taught that humility is the garment of divinity and the condition for receiving any grace. Clinging stubbornly to what you consider "the truth" can close your eyes to the fuller truth beyond you, and in this way, you harm your Church and your faith, even if you call your version of truth "theological."

Never forget: the Church does not call "theologians" those who study theology in universities, but those who know God through living experience with Him. From the beginning, the Church has said: the true theologian is the one who prays.

The same applies to today's debates about deaconesses. There is much confusion here. It is not enough to simply point to historical evidence of deaconesses and then interpret it to fit today's mindset, crafting a "new" form to suit modern thought. Scientific study requires objective research that seeks the truth. Only then can decisions be made upon it. For example, one must first know the role deaconesses played before their order disappeared, the reasons for their disappearance, and the reasons behind any movement to revive the order today. The discussion must be rooted in Tradition and a forward vision shaped by an Orthodox, patristic mind. To approach it through the lens of gender equality, or inequality, is mistaken, because this uses the spirit of the age, not theology. Likewise, treating ordination as a job of equal opportunity is wrong. Priesthood is not a business.

The Church is filled with many and varied gifts. Her Tradition has always affirmed that Christ did not choose women for the liturgical priesthood: they were not among the Twelve at the Mystical Supper where He instituted the Eucharist, nor when He breathed the Spirit upon them and gave them authority to bind and loose sins. Yet at the same time, He entrusted women as heralds of His Resurrection, sent the Spirit upon men and women alike at Pentecost, and made some of them equal to the apostles in preaching and witness. Women have served and continue to serve in countless Church ministries, whether as deaconesses, laywomen, or married women.

For decades now, Christianity has faced the temptation to reshape its theology according to dominant humanist and secular thought. This is a dangerous path, because it bends theology, spirituality, and the mind of the Church to human ideas rather than to the Gospel and Tradition.

May God preserve His Church from the traps woven against her from within and from without.

THE SYNAXARION

On October 5 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Martyr Charitina of Amisos.

Verses

That for which she prayed, the loosing of the body, Charitina receiveth, behold, by praying. On the fifth Charitina entered the city of God.

Orphaned young, Charitina was adopted by an eminent Christian man called Claudius, who brought her up as his own daughter. Charitina studied the law of God, day and night, and vowed to live in perpetual virginity as a true bride of Christ. The governor Dometius wanted to kill Charitina because she led many to the Lord. A judge ordered that her hair be cut off and live coals put on her head, but the maiden was preserved by God's power. She was bound to a wheel which began to turn, but an angel of God stopped the wheel and Charitina remained unharmed. Then the wicked judge sent some dissolute youths to take her virginity. Fearing this attack, Charitina knelt in prayer to God to receive her soul before that could happen. At that moment, her soul soared to the immortal Kingdom of Christ in 290.

On this day, we also commemorate Venerable John, bishop of Euchaïta; and Venerable Eudokimos of Vatopedi monastery on Athos. By the intercessions of Thy saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.




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
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Teen SOYO Launches New Year with First Gathering
